CLOW Gospel Reflection

Reflection: In today's gospel reading, we hear the parable of the rich man and of Lazarus – a poor man. The rich man lived a life of luxury. He had the finest clothes and the best food, and the most expensive wine. He had everything he wanted and needed. Lazarus though did not have enough food, he was suffering and in pain. He had nothing that he needed or wanted. Even though Lazarus was sitting outside the gates of the rich man's house, Lazarus did nothing to help him. Lazarus was too concerned with his own comfort that he couldn't see the needs of those around him.

Jesus once said that the poor will always be with us. We have the freedom to choose to ignore the needs of others, or to respond to them. We are all called to share whatever gifts we have with the poor.

When you think about your community, and the people that make up the community, where do you see there is suffering and hardship? What is one thing that you can do to ease that suffering? What gift can you share with those in need?
